This work requires a solid understanding of the principles, practices and objectives of policy and social planning, land use, economics and sustainable community development. You will be part of a dedicated and dynamic team, supporting and working closely with the Department's senior planner and manager.

You have an undergraduate degree in an appropriate discipline, plus a post graduate degree in Community or Regional Planning, supplemented by professional policy and development planning experience OR an equivalent combination of training and experience. Membership or eligibility for membership in either the Planning Institute of British Columbia or Canadian Institute of Planners is required as well as a valid BC driver's license.
