You will also have the ability to negotiate effectively, have sound knowledge of planning legislation and critical planning analytical skills. Housing policy experience and current planning (development) experience are also assets.

You will have a Canadian Institute of Planners recognized degree in Community or Regional Planning or a related area supplemented by professional planning experience. Membership in the Planning Institute of British Columbia and the Canadian Institute of Planners is preferred.
